CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, President Roberson called the October 28, 2020 meeting of the FGFOA Board of Directors to order at 9:04 a.m.

PRESIDENT REPORT

Mrs. Roberson presented the minutes from the August 28, 2020 and September 16, 2020 FGFOA Board meeting for review.

Mr. Colvin moved, seconded by Mrs. Strickland, to accept the minutes from the August 28, 2020 and the September 16, 2020 meeting as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

2021 Annual Conference

Mr. Shamoun presented a summary of options for the 2021 Annual Conference dates and locations now that the Boca Raton Resort and Spa is no longer available due to renovations. The two viable options are the Diplomat in Hollywood or the Hilton Bonnet Creek in Orlando. Staff recommends the Diplomat May 22 - 26, 2021 due to the potential increase in attendees being able to drive in each day.

Mr. Colvin moved, seconded by Ms. Rabel, to approve the staff recommendation for the FGFOA Annual Conference to be held at the Diplomat Resort on May 22 - 26, 2021. Mr. DiPaolo was not available for the vote. Motion passed unanimously.

Government Finance Professionals Week

Mr. Shamoun presented an updated 2021 toolkit for the Government Finance Professionals Week. He recommends the dates be March 15-21, 2021. Mr. Colvin suggests adding additional wording promoting/acknowledging finance professionals in the distributing of CARES Act funds. Mr. Colvin will provide staff with this additional wording. Mr. Cahen noted that quotes from the FGFOA President will need to be updated to reflect our current President's comments and title.

Mr. Cahen moved, seconded by Mrs. Ramsey-Chessman, to approve the Government Finance Professionals Week toolkit with these slight modifications and the date of March 15-21, 2021. Mr. DiPaolo was not available for the vote. Motion passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Certification Committee Report

Mr. Misco presented the committee report asking for direction and clarity on extending the renewal period due to COVID and whether or not that changes their new entire period. The Board feels a lot of virtual CPE is being offered with additional webinar opportunities and does not feel someone should be allowed to "double dip" by extending their deadline date and then their entire renewal period. The typical random audit of renewal should prevent this from happening. For clarification, the 12/31/20 renewal is still in place.

Mrs. Shannon Ramsey-Chessman moved, seconded by Mr. McKinney, to approve an extension for the 12/31/2021 CGFO renewal year due to COVID related issues; but if this option is exercised then you will only have 18 months to finish the next renewal which expires on June 30, 2023. Mr. Colvin voted no.

Mr. Misco presented the committee report asking for consideration is whether there will be enough proctors for the next CGFO exams in November. Mr. McKinney recommended that Ken Burke, though he is not a CGFO, be allowed as an exception to proctor an exam if needed.

Mr. McKinney moved to allow Ken Burke, former FGFOA past president, to proctor the next CGFO exam. The motion died as Mr. Burke will not be proctoring the exam.

Legislative Committee Report

Mr. Timberlake presented the committee report noting that Amber Hughes, FLC Lobbyist, is planning meetings in November/December with local legislators. Mr. Colvin will help organize these meetings.

Membership and Leadership Development Committee Report

Ms. Burns presented the committee report regarding the mentoring program. They picked 4 dates and topics for the virtual Mentoring program which will be held by Teams or Zoom. The plan is for everyone to start together and then break into smaller groups for further discussion. The recommendation of the Board is to send the link again for updated pairings. An email blast will go to the members to promote this program with a link to apply.

Membership and Leadership Development Policy Manual

Ms. Burns presented the updated Policy Manual as prepared by the committee. It was noted that there was not a red lined version available to readily compare changes. This highly recommended in the future on any Policy Manual changes.

Mr. McKinney moved, seconded by Mr. Colvin, to approve the Membership and Leadership Development Policy Manual as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Title of Item: Legislative Committee Update

Executive Summary, Explanation or Background Information:

With a later Legislative Session this year the Legislative Committee had a longer period of little activity.

The Committee's first request for feedback came in during the month of December. A newly created Local Government Efficiency Task Force had it's first meeting in December. The League of Cities was asked to develop possible items the task force may consider. Suggestions included: areas of redundancy in oversight or regulation, extraneous reports submitted to the state, or reports that are required by the state but do not lead to actionable outcomes or changes. The committee had four respondents and the complete report submitted by the committee is attached to this report.

As a reminder, Key Session Dates for 2021:

- March 2, 2021 Regular Session convenes 12:00 noon, deadline for filing bills for introduction
- April 17, 2021 Motion to reconsider made and considered the same day. All bills are immediately certified.
- April 20, 2021 50th day last day for regularly scheduled committee meetings
- April 30, 2021 60th day last day of Regular Session

Meetings will be scheduled with Legislative staff in the next month to share our interest in engaging in the process and serving as an invaluable resource in the development of legislation and analyses.

- 1. The Economic & Demographic Research reporting required in Chapter 2016-56 is just a duplication of efforts with information sent in a differing format. Even though there may not be significant time or cost savings by eliminating the EDR report, the real benefit would be elimination of misleading information about government spending. The largest problem with the EDR report is how the data is interpreted. A few examples are below:
 - a. Largo had no governmental debt outstanding last year, yet we received a D rating for debt, based presumably on the EDR report, while other cities with governmental debt received better ratings than Largo. All reported debt was in our sewer fund and was very reasonable, both in total and in annual debt service payments.
 - b. All per capita spending, revenue or debt measures are misleading for cities that serve large unincorporated populations and other non-resident groups. For example, Largo's official population is about 84,000, but we serve about 110,000 with sewer service and fire and EMS services, including unincorporated residents and neighboring cities. All per capita calculations would be much different if the "service population" of 110,000 was used instead of the official population of 84,000.
 - c. Largo also serves many additional unincorporated county residents and other cities' residents with library services because we are part of the county-wide Library Cooperative and because we are located in the center of the county. Largo also serves many thousands of non-residents with recreation/parks services, because of our central county location and several newer facilities. Largo also has a large part-time seasonal population in our mobile home parks who aren't included in the official population data.
 - d. The whole concept of comparing "total government spending" between cities is fraught with inaccuracy because cities provide so many different types of services. It really is the equivalent of comparing apples and oranges. The City of Clearwater provides water, gas, marina, and beach services, while Largo does not. And even though Clearwater and Largo both provide garbage services, Clearwater is much farther from the County disposal facility than Largo is, so their operating costs must be much higher than Largo's, because of the extra time they have to spend transporting garbage to the disposal facility.
- 2. Regarding the AFR, it takes about 16 hours to prepare, review and submit and there are no out of pocket costs. However, it' doubtful that all the AFR information is really used or needed. Could the AFR be reduced to include just the data that is actually used by the State? Again, using any AFR data to make spending or revenue comparisons between cities is most likely inaccurate and misleading. Multiple respondents mentioned how difficult it was to compare municipalities. The threshold for building reserves was developed as a "one size fits all" and does not allow for medium to small governments to weather economic downturns without impacting their staffing, making it difficult to rehire as needed.
- 3. Impact Fee studies and reporting create time drains on staffing. Charlotte County advises that in order to justify the impact fees staff spends an inordinate amount of time with a consultant to produce a report that is largely understood by few. This is due to the fact that the fee has to be based on "the most recent and localized data" by statute. Impact fee reporting has been an issue this year as well. HB1339 Requires us to report impact fees by dwelling type and schedule

- policy (flat rate, tier scaled on bedrooms or footage) which is new. And any exemptions provided for affordable housing. This has required some staff time investment. One respondent mentioned that in order to avoid having to extract this information manually, this requires a 10-digit account code. Not all systems can accommodate that. It's unclear why this information will improve transparency.
- 4. Section 11.45, FS, was amended last year to include a requirement that the Auditor General, at least once every 7 years, conduct an operational and financial audit of each large-hub commercial service airport (there are at least 4 such airport authorities). As these entities already provide for an annual financial audit conducted by a CPA firm, there is no apparent benefit to the Auditor General also conducting a financial audit every 7 years. A more efficient use of Auditor General resources could be achieved if this law were changed to require that the Auditor General conduct an operational audit, and not a financial audit, at least once every 7 years.
- 5. There are a lot of piecemeal transparency statutes and it would maybe increase efficiency if they were codified in one place (maybe Chapter 218) rather than having separate requirements for special districts, CRAs, airports, counties, and municipalities and various requirements thereof (EDR data, business license fee/tax data, budgets, amendments thereto, minutes, financials statements, etc.) scattered throughout the statutes. Would make it easier for LGs to familiarize themselves and comply with such requirements, i.e., more efficient gathering and reporting.
- 6. Periodic financial audits have generally not been effective in disclosing operational control deficiencies as evidenced by Auditor General operational audits disclosing numerous and significant findings not disclosed by the financial audits. Perhaps for some or most LGs, replacing or supplementing annual financial audits with periodic operational audit requirements would make sense. I know the "audit" word is not a favorite among finance directors, but our operational audits have many times resulted in recommendations that are beneficial to the LG, such as ways to provide for more efficient use and safeguarding of resources.
- 7. Two respondents had opposing viewpoints on the new financial reporting requirements in Section 163.387. One respondent was concerned about increased costs and staff time were providing any benefit if most of the information is already captured in a City's CAFR with a dependent special district. However, another respondent believed the financial audits would improve transparency and deter questionable expenditures. This respondent believed a few more years of audits would be required to see the benefits of the new audit requirements. Another respondent suggested moving reporting requirements to expenses vs revenue. Newer CRA's would benefit from this switch. Additional CRA comments included eliminating paper reports to a County (or other contributors) when all information is required to be published on the CRA's website.

Executive Summary, Explanation or Background Information:

The Committee worked with the Board and staff to complete the scheduling of the 2020 SOGF and identified speakers for all sessions. The sessions started on October 20th and ended on November 5th.
