Title of Item: Adjustment to CGFO policies in response to

individuals severely impacted by Hurricane Ian

Executive Summary, Explanation or Background:

The Certification Committee met on October 6th to discuss the impacts of Hurricane Ian. After addressing the how to proceed with Fall reviews and exams, the committee discussed anticipated requests for exceptions to the CGFO program requirements.

The current CGFO Policies and Procedures provides CGFO candidates up to 5 years to complete the requirements for the CGFO program. Separately, it requires those individuals that are currently CGFOs to obtain 80 hours of continuing education every two years.

Due to the devastation in Southwest Florida, specifically Lee, Collier, Hendry, Manatee and Sarasota Counties, we anticipate future requests for extension of time to meet the requirements of the CGFO program.

Recommended Action:

Our recommended action is for the Board to allow the Certification Committee the ability to grant extensions to the timeframes in the Certification Committee Policies and Procedures upon request by impacted individuals. Specifically, to allow current CGFO candidates an extension of up to one year to obtain their certification and to allow current CGFOs with renewals due 6/30/23 an extension of up to six months to meet their continuing education requirements. For the CPE requirement, any additional time take will reduce the amount of time available to meet the CPE requirement for the period ending 6/30/25.

Additionally, if directed by the Board, the Certification Committee will develop a permanent amendment to the Policies and Procedures to allow for extensions, upon request, due to similar circumstances.

Title of Item: Revised Fall CGFO Review and Exam Dates

Executive Summary, Explanation or Background:

The Certification Committee met on October 6th to discuss the impacts of Hurricane Ian. After discussion, our recommendation is for the Fall CGFO reviews to be changed from in-person to web-based and moved to November 1st through 3rd (Tuesday – Thursday). The exam reviewers had indicated their ability to conduct the reviews on these days.

The Exam will be moved to Friday November 4th. It will be conducted in person at 4 locations: Orlando, Palatka, Plantation and West Palm Beach. These locations are in close proximity to the candidates registered to take the exams and have Proctors and sites available to host. Additionally, each location has hotels nearby in case candidates do not want to drive the morning of the exams.

This was approved by the committee after input from the members and staff and is supported by the Board Liaison.

Recommended Action:

Approve the modifications to the Fall CGFO review and exam schedule and locations.
