There are now 553 active CGFO's in the certification program. There are currently 276 CGFO candidates which includes 15 new candidates since October. Due to the concern that 85 of these new candidates are at risk of not completing their certification requirements within their 5-year period due to CGFO testing being cancelled because of Hurricane Ian, the Board has approved an extension of their 5-year renewal period which will now end 06/30/2023. Spring reviews and exams are currently open for registration.

Florida lawmakers propose \$50 million bridge loan for storm-ravaged localities

Lawmakers this week will consider a proposal that would create an emergency bridge loan for localities hit by Florida's last two major storms — and throw in another \$650 million into Gov. Ron DeSantis' state emergency fund. What it does: The bill, HB 1B in the House and SB 2B in the Senate, would create the Local Government Emergency Response Bridge Loan program with a one-time \$50 million allocation from the state's general revenue fund. The program is only available to local governments that were impacted by Hurricane Ian in September and Hurricane Nicole in November. The loans can only be used to continue government operations "or modify such operations to meet disaster-related needs," according to the bill. Lawmakers will hear the bill on Wednesday in the Senate Health Policy Committee. The measure was filed on Monday by state Sen. Ben Albritton (R-Wauchula), who said the bridge loan is meant for local governments such as Fort Myers Beach — which bore the brunt of Hurricane Ian and lost millions of dollars in property tax revenue.

New broadband funding for rural communities

Bringing high-speed internet to North Florida.

Several of our Big Bend counties, including Leon, Gadsden, Suwannee, Lafayette, Liberty and Hamilton, all receiving millions of dollars to deploy fiber-optic cable. People are excited to see the first steps taken to help improve internet access in Gadsden County communities.

"We could be just one road over from highspeed broadband and so with all of this coming to the county now it definitely opens up those avenues for everybody in the county and not just those that are on the main highways," said Elijah Key, one of the thousands of people affected by slow, poor quality internet connection in Gadsden County.

South Florida cities score most of \$275 million state money for sea level rise projects

South Florida is getting more than \$180 million of bigger pipes, stronger stormwater pumps and higher canals to deal with rising sea levels — the majority of this year's state funds.

Gov. Ron DeSantis announced the latest round of Resilient Florida grants Monday afternoon. South Florida cities, which face the highest risk to life and property value from the two feet of sea level rise expected in the state by 2060, took home most of the \$275 million pot.

Florida lawmakers eye oversight of local utilities

Florida House members Tuesday raised the possibility of giving state regulators more oversight of municipal utilities.

Members of the House Energy, Communications & Cybersecurity Subcommittee repeatedly touched on the issue as they received presentations about the Florida Public Service Commission and the state Office of Public Counsel.

The Public Service Commission regulates forprofit utilities such as Florida Power & Light and Duke Energy Florida but has little oversight of municipal utilities.



The \$811 million affordable housing bill, recently unveiled by Florida's Senate president, would eliminate the possibility of rent-control laws — a limit on rent to prevent price gouging — by "deleting the authority of local governments to adopt or maintain laws, ordinances, rules, or other measures that would have the effect of imposing controls on rents."
